		Further to the study undertaken by Cllrs. J. Bull and N. Carter, requests for cutting back vegetation at several points along the road were submitted to West Berkshire Council to improve sight lines on the bends and would be followed up on by the Clerk. It was considered unnecessary for the addition of further signage on the sides of the road approaching the bends but Cllr. C. 		The Committee was advised by Cllr. C. Lewis that West Berkshire Council have installed the white villages speed gates for the village and cleaned the adjacent speed limit signs. It was noted that only one gate appears in some locations due to the topography of land along sides of the roadway.

		As well as the bends along Brewery Common, several other sights had been identified for cutting back and these had been reported to West Berkshire Council in January. The Clerk will follow up with WBC where requests are outstanding.	JB/Clerk
