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Independent Examiner's Report to the Stratfield Mortimer Parochial Church Council

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 December 2018, which are set out on pages 3 to 7.

Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and Independent Examiner

The trustees of the charity, the members of the PCC, are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. They consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commissioners section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act; and
- state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of an Independent Examiner's Statement

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission.

An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as the church's trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the next section.

- A All interest earned on Restricted Funds is available as Unrestricted Funds and is recorded as a receipt of the General Fund (see note 5).
- B The Capital Fund arises from a legacy in 1995. The PCC has resolved that it should be used only for capital projects or major replacement of equipment. During the year money was raised for Bell Tower repairs; all such funds were spent on Bell Tower repairs during the year.
- C During the year funds were raised to contribute to the cost of roof repairs. The PCC intends to continue to raise funds for roof repairs and to fund such repairs out of the Long Term Maintenance and Capital Funds

10 Endowment funds

The St John's School House Trust consists of three endowment fund investments with the Central Board of Finance. The original cost of the investments in the three funds at the end of the year was £65,209 (2017: £65,209). At 31 December 2018 the market value of these investments was £114375.23 (2017 - £117210.54).

All interest earned on Endowment Funds is available as Unrestricted Funds and is recorded as a receipt of the General Fund (see note 5).

11 Regular Giving

Regular giving ensures the Parish has a more stable financial base from which to carry on its ministry. At the end of the year, there were 66 separate standing orders set up, including 2 which commenced during 2018 (6 historic standing orders were stopped in 2018). Of the 62 in force at the end of the year, 55 were regular monthly contributions and 7 were single payments. The average monthly contribution was around £40, with contributions ranging between less than £5 and £250 per month; the average of the 6 single payments was around £190 with a range of less than £5 up to £400.
