HEDGE CUTTING

TWO NEW SPEED INDICATOR **DEVICES**

Two new Smiley Speed Indicator Devices (SIDs) have recently been purchased for use around the village to help tackle speeding. These devices show drivers their speed and encourage safer driving through Mortimer.

SMALL ELECTRICAL **RECYCLING CENTRE (WEE)**

Supplied by West Berkshire Council and kept at the West End Road Carpark by Dads shop.

A few points to note:

- Leaving items next to the bin is Fly Tipping- please do not do this
- Small electrical items (WEEE) are anything that needs a plug or battery to work and are small enough to fit in your hand or a small shopping bag, such as toasters, hair dryers, phones, electric toothbrushes, and power tools.







AN UPDATE FROM THE ESTATE **MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE**

Several improvements have recently taken place around Mortimer:

- Playground: New wet-pour safety surfacing has been installed around three large pieces of equipment on the Fairground, making play safer for children.
- War Memorial: A group of volunteers has carried out remedial works to help preserve this important village landmark.
- Fairground Fence: Following a spate of vandalism, the Parish Council's Custodian has undertaken repairs to the fencing.
- West End Road Carpark: Volunteers from Greening Mortimer, working alongside the Parish Council, have carried out weeding along the carpark border to help keep the area tidy and welcoming.

The Parish Council thanks everyone involved for their hard work and commitment to keeping our village safe and welcoming.

SMPC OBJECTS TO WEST END FARM DEVELOPMENT PROPOSAL



Stratfield Mortimer Parish Council (SMPC) has submitted a strong objection to Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council's (B&D) Updated Proposed Spatial Strategy, which proposes allocating "Land at West End Farm, Mortimer" for around 350 homes and a Gypsy and Traveller site.

Although the site lies within Hampshire, SMPC highlights that the development would function as an extension of Mortimer, raising major concerns about sustainability, infrastructure, and the village's identity.

SMPC's key objections include:

- Conflict with B&D's own Local Plan principles, which focus growth on Basingstoke and protecting rural areas from large greenfield development.
- Failure to recognise Mortimer's Neighbourhood Plans, which set out local policies on housing type, design, lighting, flooding, energy, and transport.
- Lack of infrastructure planning, as services in Mortimer—such as schools, GP capacity, parking, and public transport—are already under pressure.
- Unsuitable transport links, with the proposed site relying heavily on car use, contrary to B&D's sustainability goals.

SMPC emphasises that any development must be guided by Mortimer's Neighbourhood Plans and accompanied by proper cross-boundary consultation and infrastructure funding.

The Council has urged B&D to remove the West End Farm site (SPS5.15) from the draft Local Plan, warning that it would cause "significant unmitigated harm" to Mortimer and neighbouring West Berkshire communities.
