The Principles Guiding the Design Codes and Policies

- 1. Reflect and enhance established character areas identified in the attached map.
- 2. Respect and reflect the scale, massing, density and rooflines of surrounding buildings limiting developments to a maximum of two stories.
 - Densities shall be reduced on the rural edge of Mortimer village to retain the open feel of the settlement and its relationship with the surrounding landscape.
- 3. Use locally distinctive materials, boundary treatments, and architectural detailing.
- 4. Emphasise the provision of 1-, 2- and 3-bedroom homes including some bungalows suitable for downsizing with a maximum of 5% 4+ bedroom homes on any development.
- 5. Maintain the 'dark sky' environment of the Parish.
- 6. Respond positively to climate change effects with emphasis on reduction of flood risk, use of water (e.g. greywater harvesting) and temperature hot spots.
- 7. Create safe, attractive, green and accessible public and private spaces.
- 8. Deliver attractive shared road spaces avoiding on-street and in-front of building carparking.
- 9. Integrate green infrastructure in accordance with the Code's environmental guidelines.
- 10. Ensure permeability for cyclists and pedestrians in all connections, including road patterns.
- 11. Retain and emphasise existing landscape views, particularly countryside vistas, prominent buildings, and important street views.
- 12. Protect dwellings designated for over-55s in perpetuity, unless extensive marketing demonstrates that such dwellings are no longer attractive to the older demographic.
- 13. Incorporate high-performance digital infrastructure both to and within properties (residential and commercial), taking into account future developments in digital technology.
